The anticipated technical and financial analyses, as well as a basic environmental assessment, will be provided to the Government in order to make important choices about the future of the plant.

by 1/5 we have agreed with the Government to mobilize grant resources of more than \$110,000 from within the World Bank for the proposed expertise that will ensure the quality of analyses the counterpart needs from internationally recognized experts," clarified Laura E. Bailey, World Bank Country Manager for Armenia. "We had hoped to have the work begin in early February, but it took some time to ensure that we selected the best possible experts".
